

Letter from the Vicarage by the Reverend Nicholas Anderson

he Ecumenical Patriarch, His All Holiness Bartholomew 1, is the primary spiritual leader of the Orthodox Christian world, and although not particularly well known in the West, has been a pioneer in engaging in dialogue with the modern world. He has focused on the role of science and technology in contemporary society, the theological imperative of tackling climate change, the plight and prospects of children today, the importance of countering human trafficking and modern slavery, and the need for all Christians to engage those issues in practical ways.

In 1989, his predecessor Ecumenical Patriarch Dimitrios wrote an encyclical letter on the issue of climate change, establishing the first day of September as a day of prayer for the protection of the natural environment. Many participating members of the World Council of Churches (WCC) have followed the patriarchate's example, not only by implementing this annual day of prayer, but also in taking seriously the commitment of the Churches in resolving the environmental crisis. Patriarch Bartholomew is clear: 'a sin against creation is a sin against God. As for any sin, we must likewise repent for the sin committed against creation.... the approach to the ecological problem on the basis of the principles of the Christian tradition demands not only repentance for the sin of the exploitation of the natural resources of the planet, namely, a radical change in mentality and behaviour, but also asceticism as an antidote to consumerism, the deification of needs and the acquisitive attitude'. True repentance implies a conversion, which means a radical change in our attitude. The environmental crisis calls for concrete actions from each one of us.

In line with Orthodox theology, the patriarch is clear that the Church cannot be solely interested in the salvation of the soul, but must also be deeply concerned with the transformation of God's entire creation. Therefore, 'Churches and believers need to understand clearly the relationship between today's ecological crisis and

our human passions of greed, materialism, self-centeredness and rapacity, which result in and lead to the current crisis that we face.' As the creation is intimately interconnected, 'a threat to nature is also a threat to humankind,'

Among several environmental issues he raises, the Patriarch has important things to say about the resource of water. He states that water is a common good. It does not belong to any individual or any industry, but is the inviolable and nonnegotiable right of every human being. He considers the economic exploitation of water by industries selling water to people who have money to buy it an ethical issue. The patriarch goes on to argue that the water industry is actually polluting the environment because of the plastic bottles it sells. Ecologists today are saying that by 2050, the oceans will contain, by weight, more plastic than fish. Plastic pollution is an environmental and social justice issue. Therefore, he argues, we should be avoiding plastic by using alternatives in our everyday life. In the light of the patriarch's call perhaps we too should shun bottled water as a small but significant step toward water justice, and encourage others to join with us.

In the mind of the patriarch, plastic pollution of water, air pollution and climate change are parallel global emergencies. They are the consequence of forgetting about the sacredness of creation. They are the disastrous results of industrialisation and our human greed. It is obvious that the environmental crisis cannot be solved without a genuine conversion of human actions. In this sense, ecology is linked with the economy. A society that does not care about the well-being of all human beings is a society that maltreats God's creation, which is blasphemy. For this reason, 'the ecological challenge of our Churches is to awake the world to the irreversible destruction of God's creation because of human sinful actions. The necessity of ecological education is not only a problem for our states, but should also be the problem of our Churches.'

Here in England, Patriarch Bartholomew does not receive as much media coverage as the Archbishop of Canterbury or the Pope, who at least receive some media coverage. Yet his is a prophetic voice, whose ministry has been devoted to raising significant issues that pertain to the common good. It is not too surprising that this was reiterated in a recent visit to the WCC's offices in Geneva, when once again he invited member churches of the WCC 'to work together in a common quest, renewing the true vocation of the church through collaborative engagement with the most important issues of justice and peace, healing a world filled with conflict, injustice and pain.' The issues he speaks of with such lucidity and passion also deserve a hearing in the public square; who knows, that may lead to the real possibility of change within governmental policies that affect all our lives.

Annual report 2016-17

From the Churchwardens

ur annual report sets out the major activities and developments over the past year. We would like to begin by thanking our deputy wardens, Margaret Creighton and Jane Donati. Margaret offered to stay on as an ex officio member of the PCC for one year to ensure the smooth transition of the churchwardens' team; she has given many years of faithful service on the PCC and in more than one term as churchwarden, and we have benefited enormously from her experience, her pastoral skills and good humour.

We are also grateful to the other members of the Standing Committee, Emma Bresslaw, our secretary, and Steve Creasy, our treasurer. Emma keeps meticulous records of all the essential administration of the PCC, takes minutes and ensures that our meetings are run according to the often-complex rules of the Church of England.

Steve has once again this year efficiently and professionally managed our budgets, accounts and finances. It is a considerable task and he undertakes it willingly and with characteristic attention to detail and utter competence. The way in which he presents the accounts is always clear and understandable. We must also thank Tony Armstrong, who is our Stewardship Recorder, as well as counting, recording and banking our collections each week.

Nicholas has continued to lead us tirelessly and quietly, supporting all that we do as churchwardens and ensuring that all the work of the parish is underpinned by prayer. He takes almost all our services, and has continued a tradition of holding morning and evening prayer on weekdays (open to all the congregation). He also introduced night prayer during Advent and Lent. We are delighted that James Brown will be joining Nicholas as curate in July and look forward to supporting James in his ministry.

We were pleased to learn that David Halsey, one of our Readers, had been accepted to train for the ministry; we are actively supporting David during his training, though, understandably, the demands of training on top of a full-time job mean that he has had to step back from his commitments in the parish. The other Readers, David Nye and Lauryn Awbrey, continue to offer support to Nicholas. Our worship is also enhanced by the music at St John's. Roger Carter has directed the music for more than 40 years, ably supported by the choir, who particularly excel on occasions such as our community carol service. The now well-established Junior Choir also continues to flourish and has delighted us with some beautifully sung anthems at the monthly all-age services. Grateful thanks go to Terry Charlston, who generously gave of his time to cover Madeleine Venner's maternity leave, thus ensuring the continuity of the Junior Choir.

On a gloriously sunny weekend in May we opened our doors to the parish and local community when we held an Open Day on the Saturday, followed by a special service of Songs of Praise, hosted by the BBC's Pam Rhodes, on the Sunday. On the

Saturday, visitors were treated to guided tours round the church, flower-arranging demonstrations, and organ recitals and in the church hall there was a barbeque and various displays from our church groups. Our Songs of Praise was led by a larger-than-usual choir and ensemble of musicians drawn from the congregation.

Continuing on the theme of parish outreach, one of the biggest developments in the past year has been our exploration of what to do with the current hall, which has reached the end of its useful life. We have been very fortunate to have had a small, dedicated steering group who have consulted carefully with existing hall users, the local community, and representatives from the local council and the church advisory body and have carried out extensive research into the experiences of other churches who have redeveloped their hall. In November, the steering group presented a detailed report on their findings, outlining several options for the hall. After careful consideration, the PCC agreed to commission a feasibility study to establish what might be possible for a new Parish Centre. A firm of architects has been appointed to produce this study, and we will look forward to exploring their findings, and continue to seek God's guidance on how we can use our facilities to further our mission in the parish.

Alongside the exciting, future-focused activities, the day-to-day work of the parish continues. The church and the existing hall require ongoing maintenance, whether that is to do with the heating, leaks, light bulbs needing replacement, we are fortunate to have a team of dedicated individuals who take pride in our splendid building and in the maintenance and repair of our hall and grounds. We are

particularly grateful to David Christian and the members of the Fabric Committee and to John Jones, who responds to many emergency calls in relation to the hall.

Thanks also go to Lynn Dolby, who has stepped down after many years of quietly ensuring the supplies of coffee, tea and biscuits were kept topped up for our Sunday morning coffee time. The volunteers who make and serve the coffee are among the unsung heroes and heroines of the congregation; we are aware that some churches aren't able to offer coffee every week as help is not forthcoming, so we don't take that help for granted.

At the APCM last year, Jonathan Holt stepped down from his role as editor of the magazine, with particular responsibility for the production and control of print; the magazine is an important tool for us in our outreach, being delivered free to every home in the parish. Jonathan's contribution was invaluable. Rob Newby has relinquished his role of ensuring the magazine is distributed to the team of coordinators and then to those who deliver; we are grateful to you all. We are delighted that Steve Whiting has stepped forward to take over the distribution.

Our children and young people are an important and valued part of our community. Junior Church has been run for the past five years by Celia Halsey, but with changes to her family and work commitments, Celia decided to step down at the end of 2016. Her final nativity service was a brilliant way to end her time, and a tribute to Celia's dedication and creativity. A new group of parents led by Naomi Burnett has now taken over the running of Junior Church and we look forward to seeing how they will grow and develop in this new phase.

The journey continues

During last Lent, David Halsey, who's been one of our Readers for more than ten years, has been on placement in Luton, as part of the training for ordination he began last August. We recently caught up with him to find out more about this and how it's all been going. (Ed)

S ince last August I've had a variety of new experiences, which have been nerve-wracking, inspiring, challenging and humbling. So it was good to be re-invigorated at the Easter Monday pilgrimage service at the Abbey with a refreshed call to live God's love with 'generosity, joy, imagination and courage'.

I am training part-time, for two years, with the Eastern Regional Ministry Course, which takes students from such dioceses as St Albans and Norwich, and even from Europe, with one member of my support group flying in from Norway! As to be expected, we are a diverse bunch of people from different styles of Church and with different life experiences and perspectives. This adds significantly to the process, as we listen, understand and grow together.

The training works on an academicyear basis, starting with a week's summer school in August (aka 'Vicar Boot Camp' in my house). There are then six further residential weekends a year, an evening a week in St Albans during term time, plus study time for essays and other written assignments.

I've been learning about pastoral care, which includes bereavement and funeral ministry, seeking to deepen my spirituality, exploring the meaning and significance of baptism, marriage

and communion and developing my appreciation of other faiths. The latter involved spending several days in Leicester eating at a langar (the communal kitchen) at a Sikh Gurdwara (to the delight of one of my colleagues at work), visiting a mosque and a Hindu Temple, as well as spending time in several churches.

This last Lent, I've also had the chance to spend some time 'on placement' with the vicar of another church, which has given me the opportunity to share in the life of a very different parish from St John's – All Saints, Luton – and to appreciate the wonderfully challenging diversity of God's people and different ways of worshipping (such as the vibrant Ghanaian Church which meets at All Saints).

My time in Luton has also opened my eyes to the Church of England's 'presence and engagement' approach to ministry, which aims to equip us to be authentically present in multi-religious areas and to engage positively with communities of other faiths. This has offered me a range of inspiring and challenging personal encounters, including attending a meeting of the Luton Council of Faiths and going as part of a group to visit a very hospitable mosque, which was having an open day.

So, as well as learning academically, I've been experiencing a lot, and generally being kept very busy as I continue to find time for my full-time job in central London and to keep up with all the things my family are doing, too! Alongside that, it's really good to be experiencing some different things at St John's, including giving the address at a baptism, but it

Visit to the Holy Land

Wednesday 7 – Friday 16 February 2018
A pilgrimage to the Holy Land is a very special event in the lives of many Christians. An Embrace the Middle East Encounter Tour will give you the opportunity to visit places that would have been familiar to Jesus, as well as those that have developed since as a result of His life and ministry. You will meet the 'Living Stones' – Christians who live and work in this beautiful but divided land and learn how they act as 'salt and light' in their communities. There will also be plenty of opportunity for worship and reflection and time for fun and relaxation too.

The tour will be led by the regional managers of Embrace, a charity which we support as a parish. The managers are Su McClellan and Neil Graham, who are both very familiar with the land and its people as well as the projects that Embrace supports in both Israel and Palestine.

Wednesday: we fly from Luton to Tel Aviv and transfer to Bethlehem.

Thursday: a day in Bethlehem visiting the Shepherd's Fields, the Church of the Nativity, and meeting Embrace's partner the Bethlehem Arab Society.

Friday: visit the Separation Barrier and some of the people affected by it. Then travel to the Negev to visit Herod's winter palace, the Masada Fortress and then onto

the ancient city of Jericho.

Saturday: our first trip to Jerusalem, beginning at the Mount of Olives and finishing up at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre and the Western Wall.

Sunday: join a local Palestinian congregation for worship. After lunch return to Jerusalem visiting the beautiful church of St Anne and finishing up at the Cenacle.

Monday: back to Jerusalem to visit Yad Vashem, the Holocaust Museum. In the afternoon we will visit an Israeli settlement.

Tuesday: we leave Bethlehem, head up the Jordan Valley to Galilee, take a boat on the Sea of Galilee and go onto Nazareth

Wednesday: up early to visit Mount Tabor, then on to the Jezreel Valley and Megiddo before returning to Nazareth.

Thursday: visit the Church of the Annunciation and in the afternoon the Sepphoris National Park to see the amazing Roman ruins and mosaics.

Friday: travel along the coast road to visit the Roman ruins of Caesarea before going on to the ancient port of Jaffa, and then returning to Tel Aviv for the flight home.

We are delighted to report that we have taken another key step on the journey to building our new Parish Centre. After a rigorous selection process during the month of February, the PCC are very pleased to announce that the architectural practice MEB Design Ltd have been chosen to produce design options and undertake the feasibility study.

MEB Design Ltd is a medium-sized architectural practice, with three offices located in Oxford, London and Kent. The selection panel met MEB's Director, Mark Eddison, and Associate Des Hill, and were impressed with their extensive experience

of church building projects, which includes the parish centre for St Paul's church in St Albans. MEB describe their vision as 'building communities through creativity – one design at a time' and their mission as designing 'inspiring spaces that bring people together to live, work, learn and worship.'

MEB are currently working closely with our technical team, which includes David Christian, Matt Barter, James Hilman, Neil Maclure and Liz Sergeant. Once draft design options are sufficiently developed, the selection process will include consultations with key users of the church hall and the congregation.


