O, Why Are We Waiting

O why are we waiting...? is a carol familiar to many of us, often sung during school years whilst bored and waiting for something to happen. It is, of course, sung to the tune *Adeste Fideles*, well-known to us as the Christmas carol 'O come all ye faithful'. It's sung at most carol services in churches around the globe at this time of year during the approach to Christmas Day, the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ.

We are all waiting, just as the carol proclaims. It's not idle waiting but, instead, active preparation, looking ahead to Christmas and thinking about all the things we need to do before Christmas Day, from planning to visiting relatives to buying and wrapping presents and organising Christmas Dinner. There might be a mixture of feelings associated with that looking forward: slow-building excitement; dread of visiting certain family members; worry over how we can afford it all... the list goes on.

In Church we're also waiting – but not just to celebrate Christmas; we are also thinking about what it will mean when Jesus comes again to be with us. Like the waiting for Christmas, it is an active sort of waiting, when we try and make ourselves ready by thinking about whether we're really living the way that Jesus asks us to

in his teachings. And that, too, just like the waiting for Christmas, brings mixed feelings.

Waiting is a complex thing that comes in different guises, from the facile to the complex, and evokes different emotions in us. To see what I mean, you just have to think of some of the types of waiting we go through in life: for the train or bus; test or exam results; hospital appointments; pregnancy... Some of these are very complex and can often mingle joy and sorrow, relief and anxiety. The key thing about waiting, however, is that it is always better when shared with someone else. That's true whether you are both waiting for the same thing or whether you're just sharing your story with an ear ready to listen. The same is important during the Christmas period, too. It isn't about the worries that inevitably come if we fixate on having all the things we want to make it a 'good' Christmas. It's about the quality of time we spend with those whom we love.

Jesus came into a waiting, expectant, world, to build relationships with us and to help us build our relationships with God and with each other. That's what we should remember during the seasons of Advent and Christmas. That is the hope we actively wait for. ●

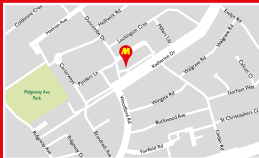

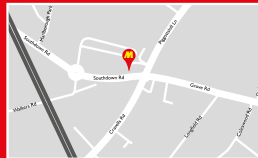

Churchwardens' Report

An autumn highlight of this year was the news that at long last we have planning permission for our proposed new parish centre. We are tremendously grateful for all of the hard work of the various groups who have got us this far in our ambitious plans to enhance our ministry in our parish and to provide a centre that is modern and appropriate for our needs and to serve the community in Southdown. We are now entering the next phase of this project – raising the funds to build it. Look out for more information on this in the future.

Autumn at St. John's began with an All-Age Service celebrating the return to school, college, or university, in which school bags were blessed and the interesting contrast of hopes for a successful new academic year mixed with anxiety about coping with new faces and places was explored.

The Southdown Festival Weekend took place from 6-8 September and along with many other events, St John's provided a Coffee Concert by our Director of Music, Roger Carter. The fete at the Grove School was also well supported by St John's. On the Sunday of the festival, we hosted an afternoon of Songs of Praise. A variety of local people chose hymns with particular meaning to them and they explained their choices; the singing was joyful, from both the augmented choir and the congregation. A special mention must be made of the members of Faith and Light, a group for those with additional needs, as their mimed version of the Lord's Prayer

was an absolute delight and touched the hearts of all those present. Refreshments followed the service and formed a lovely finish to the weekend. We especially thank James Brown, our curate, who was instrumental in the realisation of all of the activities both at St John's and more widely in Southdown.

Throughout September and up to our Harvest Celebration, St John's has focused, in both its services and other activities, on God's Creation and our role in its preservation and conservation. At this time, it has been very pertinent to pray, think and consider the environment, climate change, and what we as individuals, and as an organisation, can do to support and resolve this important issue. The Eco-Church Group, led by James Brown, has evaluated church practices according to standards set by the environmental organisation A Rocha. This is a continuing project and will permeate many aspects of St John's daily life and that of its community. Ways to be more 'green' were explored in the Study Group.

The Harvest All-Age Service was held on 6 October and the church was decorated to assail our senses and remind us of the fruits of planet earth. Our collections went to the Bishop of St Albans' Light Up Tanzania Appeal – a project to increase access to light and electricity in that country; physical gifts of food went to the local food-bank. A family quiz and, appropriately, a ploughman's lunch, followed the service. Thanks to Paul Bedding for the

intriguing quiz and to all who helped provide the lunch. Again, a fitting conclusion to a very traditional season and reflective of universal current concerns.

A Deanery Evensong was hosted at St John's in October. Members of churches in the Wheathampstead Deanery came together at St. John's for a service of sung Evensong, led by a rousing 80-strong choir of all ages from St John's and neighbouring parishes and directed by Roger Carter. This was followed by a glass of wine and an opportunity to meet friends and colleagues from the Deanery.

Evensong is usually a traditional service which helps to quietly round off a busy Sunday. Here at St John's we alternate between Evensong, Taizé services, which involve prayer and meditation through simple chants, and Celtic services, during which a topic is explored through readings, poetry, presentation of facts, singing, prayer and quietness. These are advertised in the lists of services.

Remembrance Sunday on 10 November is always a reflective time and even more so this year, since it is eighty years since the outbreak of World War II, an event within the living memory of many, which changed so much in Europe and the wider world.

The consequences of the conflict have shaped both individuals, families, nations and institutions. In these politically somewhat unsettling times, it helps to centre our thinking, when we remember those times of great conflict and the bravery and stoicism of many peoples.

On the first day of December it will be Advent, the beginning of the church year and the countdown to our celebrations at Christmas. Please see the detailed lists of services for that season, so important in the church year and to many families. We look forward to welcoming you to St John's at any service or at any time – during the day the church is almost always open. Our Lady Chapel, towards the rear of the church as you enter, is a particularly peaceful and contemplative place.

A large number of people, many of whom do not regularly attend church or publicise themselves, volunteer at St John's in a huge variety of capacities and roles. It would be too lengthy to list them all here but it a great privilege to acknowledge them all and say thank you, even if those words sometimes seem rather inadequate.

How to have a GREEN Christmas

Presents

Think ‘quality not quantity’. A gift is more special if it comes with care and time rather than just being something to fill a space under the tree that will be thrown away come January. Try fewer, more meaningful presents.

Each Christmas 4000 tonnes of products arrive from China. Try to give locally made gifts or experiences, like tickets, subscriptions or meals out.

You might like to challenge the family to give each other presents from charity shops or maybe try a ‘secret santa’.

Help to cultivate the spirit of generosity in children by encouraging them to pick out a couple of toys they would be happy to give to the charity shop.

Present Wrapping

Wrap presents with kindness for the environment. Shiny, foil wrapping ‘paper’ and ribbon can’t be recycled and will go to landfill. Try wrapping in beautiful, seasonal scarves or decorating reusable cloth bags, or with natural ribbon around newspaper. Also remember that glittery Christmas cards are not recyclable and will spend their lives in landfill.

DEFRA estimates that you could wrap the whole of Guernsey with last Christmas’s discarded wrapping paper! Make sure to recycle any paper used.

Food

Researchers from The University of Manchester calculate that a typical Christmas meal generates the equivalent of 20kg of carbon dioxide emissions*. Most of this comes through the life

cycle of a turkey but other aspects contribute, including transport and kitchen preparation. Think about the ways you can reduce your carbon footprint. Being sensible with meat consumption, treating your-self to locally sourced products, and even not over cooking the sprouts will all help!

Bigger drinks bottles help! It is less wasteful to buy larger bottles than lots of small ones. Cheers!

Trees

Despite recently published research from the plastic tree industry, real trees are generally better environmentally than their PVC counterparts which aren’t recyclable and have probably been shipped great distances, not to mention the fossil fuels used in their production.

The environmental impact of your tree will obviously vary depending on where it comes from, how it is grown, and how it is disposed of. Friends of the Earth recommend that we search for locally grown trees or at least for those from the UK and ideally with an FSC certification.

Don’t be tempted to throw away your plastic tree in order to ‘go green’, though. That would defeat the point!

We wish you a merry Christmas full of kindness and goodness, not only to you and your loved ones, but even to the whole planet!

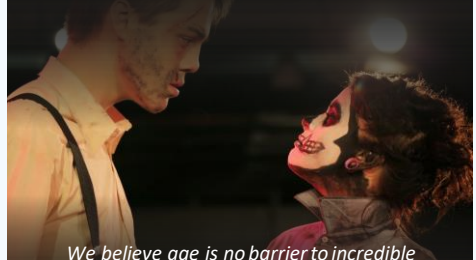

Getting to know the congregation

An interview with Liz MacDonald

How long have you lived in the area?

We moved to Harpenden in 2011, originally to Cravells Road. That was when it was just the two of us, and then we had our daughter Emily in 2013, which is when we moved to Eastmoor Park and here we had Charlotte, our second daughter.

We had been living London for a couple of years but wanted to move somewhere that felt a bit more 'normal'! Somewhere that was less busy. So we looked around and really liked Harpenden.

So what do you do with your time in and out of London?

In London, I work four and half days a week as a solicitor. In my free time I like being out of London as much as possible! Life's quite busy because we both work and we've got the children. We like going to National Trust properties together on the weekend. We really just enjoy getting out and about outside with the children. Oh, and we're into doing lots of art and crafts with them as well. They love that.

And you're involved at St John's as well, aren't you? What is that like?

Yes, it's great. I've recently started helping out with the Junior Church and am on the PCC and have been for about a year now. I originally started trying to go to St Johns when I first moved to Harpenden, before I had the children, but decided that 9.30am was just too early! But now 9.30am is hours and hours after I get up, so it's fine! How things change. I try to go as often as I can. It can be hard to get everyone out of the house and work out who's coming and who's not coming so I don't make it every Sunday but try to go as often as I can. It's

a beautiful building and a very friendly church community.

And what does your faith mean to you?

I didn't grow up going to church but I started going at university. I suppose I don't experience it just on an intellectual level and, actually, I don't really want to. It's quite simplistic for me in that I feel very happy and peaceful and often very emotional when I'm in church. I just feel that that is a very special feeling and it can't be happening for no reason.

I suppose I haven't really explored it in any huge amount of detail and I'm slightly reluctant to do so actually. I just enjoy the feeling that I have when I'm in church and that's a lovely thing. I think it might be because my mind is so busy the whole time. I have quite an intellectual job and then there's the act of juggling and diary-planning and I almost kind of don't want that in my spiritual life. I just enjoy the fact that it's simple. It's one of the few things that is simple. I mean, of course, it's not simple but I worry that if I start exploring it any further it'll become another complicated thing. And I know my husband always encourages me to go because I always come back in a better mood! ●

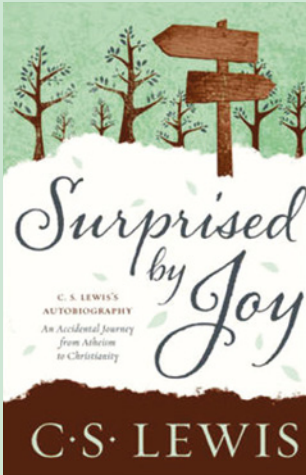

Life with M.E.

A year ago, things were very different to how they are now. As this magazine goes to print, it will mark one year since I fell ill. You may know me from St John's; I'm the one in the wheelchair at the back. Sometimes I'm strong enough to turn up using just my walking stick, but for the majority of the time it's powerchair and me, joining the congregation in weekly prayer.

You see, prior to getting ill a year ago, I was an active, relatively healthy person. I had spent ten years as a primary school teacher and had just returned to work from a year's maternity leave. Despite living with sleepless nights and everything that life with a new-born involves, I'd think nothing of attending back-to-back baby classes with my daughter Evie and think nothing of walking to and from town a mile and a half each way. Walking was one of my main hobbies and I walked everywhere. I had more energy when Evie was tiny than I do now.

November 2018 was when it all started going wrong. One chest infection after another, each sending my asthmatic lungs haywire, put me in hospital on nebulisers and intravenous medicine. I have never recovered.

Slowly but surely over the last year, I have lost my mobility, my walking limit now around 20 metres. You'll often see me wheeling through Southdown on my hired

powerchair, but for the majority of the time I'm lying down on the sofa, laptop on, and writing for my blog. Funnily enough there aren't many jobs one can do while lying on the sofa, but blogging is one of them. I set up Mummying and M.E. (www.mummyingandme.com) to document my life with M.E. but particularly how I'm getting used to life in a wheelchair.

But what is it that living with M.E. actually involves? Contrary to popular opinion, M.E. is not simply 'being tired all the time'. While fatigue is the main symptom, this is not the same as 'being tired'. M.E. is a multi-system disorder, for which medical professionals are not yet able to pinpoint an exact biomarker. That is, there isn't yet a specific blood test to diagnose the condition. Diagnosis is made on studying a patient's symptoms: post-exertional malaise (feeling significantly more unwell following any type of exertion), a clear starting point to the fatigue, muscle or joint pain, constant sore throat, flu-like symptoms, headaches, sleep problems, and problems thinking, remembering or concentrating. The combination of symptoms to each individual is different, with each person having more significant symptoms than others.

One may think this all sounds terribly depressing and how could one possibly find the mental energy to keep going? Well, strangely enough, I can. Through St John's

and the support from the congregation and ministry team, I have found a sense of peace I could only ever have dreamt of. There's no sugar coating the fact that living with M.E. is not easy, each and every day being a challenge, but finding God through St John's has made it all OK. No matter how bad each day gets (and boy do the days get tough when your legs decide to stop working), I always know God is there and when I turn up to church on Sunday, I

will face the most friendly, kind and generous group of people I've ever met.

To each and every person who simply just gives that smile each Sunday, thank you. And if I haven't met you already, look out for me round Southdown, my power-chair is one not to be missed.

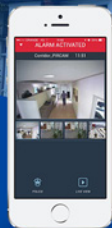

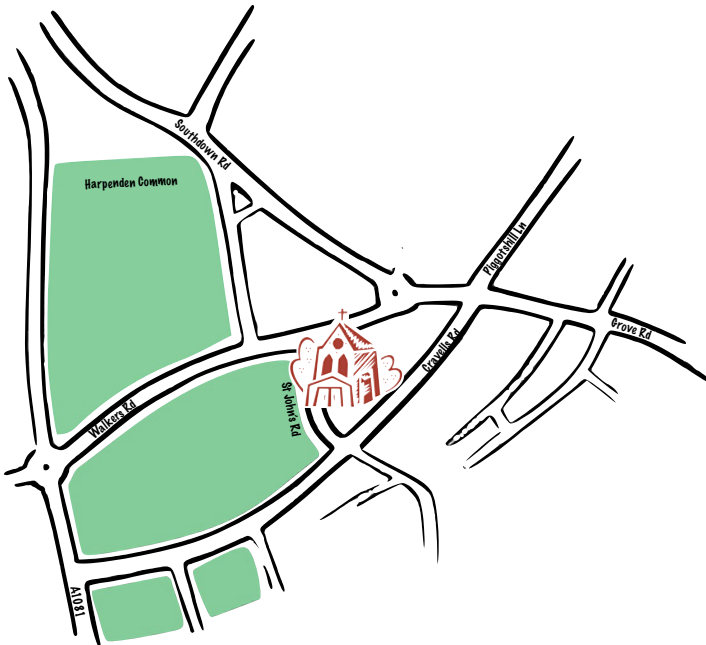
