The Season of Advent

ADVENT is a solemn and beautiful season that marks the beginning of the Church year. It is a time of watching and waiting for the coming of Christ, the true light. We wait both for the birth of the Baby in the manger, God made flesh, and for Christ's second coming, as glorious King and Judge of the entire world. It is a season of hope and expectation, of new beginnings; a time to go inwards, to prepare to welcome the Christ-child into our hearts and lives — whether afresh, or for the first time.

However, in our society, it seems as though Christmas is already here, and has been for some time. This period is often a time of busyness, usually set aside for shopping or last-minute arrangements for Christmas Day. As Christians, our worship offers the opportunity for us to stop, and step out of our frantic lives; to give proper attention to real spiritual preparation for the coming of the divine Word. Here, we are invited contemplate the story of our salvation, the story that God has been weaving for centuries and continues to weave, as He prepares our hearts and minds for the coming of Christ.

By listening to the scriptures filled with God's promises of salvation, we may have a renewed sense of confidence that God does, indeed, come to us when we seek him in prayer and that, come Christmas morning, we feel enabled to join with the angels and shepherds in greeting our Lord Jesus with hearts and minds prepared for the joy of his Incarnation. So let us watch, and wait, and pray. Amen. Come, Lord Jesus!
