SUNDAY READINGS AND PRAYERS

THE COLLECT

Almighty and everlasting God, who stooped to raise fallen humanity through the child-bearing of blessed Mary: grant that we, who have seen your glory revealed in our human nature and your love made perfect in our weakness, may daily be renewed in your image and conformed to the pattern of your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

NEW TESTAMENT: Galatians 4.4-17

⁴But when the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, ⁵in order to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as children. ⁶And because you are children, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, 'Abba! Father!' ⁷So you are no longer a slave but a child, and if a child then also an heir, through God.

8 Formerly, when you did not know God, you were enslaved to beings that by nature are not gods. ⁹Now, however, that you have come to know God,

or rather to be known by God, how can you turn back again to the weak and beggarly elemental spirits? How can you want to be enslaved to them again? ¹⁰You are observing special days, and months, and seasons, and years. ¹¹I am afraid that my work for you may have been wasted. 12 Friends, I beg you, become as I am, for I also have become as you are. You have done me no wrong. ¹³You know that it was because of a physical infirmity that I first announced the gospel to you; ¹⁴though my condition put you to the test, you did not scorn or despise me, but welcomed me as an angel of God, as Christ Jesus. ¹⁵What has become of the goodwill you felt? For I testify that, had it been possible, you would have torn out your eyes and given them to me. ¹⁶Have I now become your enemy by telling you the truth? ¹⁷They make much of you, but for no good purpose; they want to exclude you, so that you may make much of them.

GOSPEL READING: Luke 1. 46-55

46 And Mary said,

'My soul magnifies the Lord,

- ⁴⁷ and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour,
- ⁴⁸ for he has looked with favour on the lowliness of his servant. Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed;
- ⁴⁹ for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name.
- ⁵⁰ His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation.
- ⁵¹ He has shown strength with his arm; he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts.
- ⁵² He has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly;
- ⁵³ he has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty.
- ⁵⁴ He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy,
- ⁵⁵ according to the promise he made to our ancestors, to Abraham and to his descendants for ever.'
